Triumph	Mid-harvest. Fruit is firm, pleasently tart w/beautiful red color & occassional stem bowl russesting. Scab tolerant, good storage life, and tasty for fresh eating. From the same creators of Honeycrisp
Winesap	Late-harvest. Fruit is medium in size. Skin color is yellow w/red stripes. Apple is crisp & juicy w/a course texture. Good for canning. Keeps well.

Bing	Mid-harvest. Fruit is top quality and large. Skin color is dark burgundy red. Cherry is meaty, sweet & juicy. Excellent for canning.
Black Gold	Late-harvest. Fruit is large, deep red & sweet.

PLUM/PRUNE	
Beauty	Early-harvest. Fruit is medium in size & heart shaped. Skin color is bright red. Plum is sweet & juicy w/a very good taste. Good for fresh eating or cooking.
Early Italian Prune	Mid-harvest. Fruit is dark purple. Flesh is yellow/greenish that turns dark wine color when cooked. Flavor is rich & very sweet when fully ripe. Super for fresh eating, drying, and canning. Freestone.
Italian Prune	Late-harvest. Fruit is large and oval. Skin color is purplish black. Prune tastessweet with some tartness. Good for fresh eating.

A Note on Pollination:

Unless classified "self-fertile", fruit trees require a pollinator (a tree of the same fruit, but different variety) in order to produce fruit. Self-fertile trees do not require a pollinator to produce fruit, however, even self-fertile trees may be more productive with another variety.

Pollen Sterile:

This means that the pollen is sterile and will not pollinate another variety of the same fruit. In this case, other trees will pollinate this variety. For example; a Gravenstein will not pollinate another apple, however, another apple will pollinate a Gravenstein. You would have to then get a third tree to pollinate the other tree that is pollenating the Gravenstein.
